

## Chapter 6.08

### OTHER ANIMALS AND FOWL

6.08.01 Livestock prohibited in city limits. Any person who shall keep livestock roped, staked, penned or enclosed within the corporate limits of the City of Harrison, Arkansas, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

For the purpose of this chapter, the term "livestock" shall mean horse, cattle, hogs, and/or animals customarily found on a farm.

Any person who shall be found to be in violation of this chapter shall be punished in any amount not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), and each day that said animal is kept within the corporate limits in violation of this chapter shall constitute a separate offense.

6.08.02 Fowl prohibited in city limits. Any person who shall keep chickens, guinea, geese, ducks, or other fowl within the corporate limits of the City of Harrison, Arkansas, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

For the purpose of this chapter, the term "fowl" shall mean any domestic or wild bird ordinarily of the fowl family.

Any person who shall be found to be in violation of this chapter shall be punished in any amount not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), and each day that said fowl is kept within the corporate limits in violation of this chapter shall constitute a separate offense.

6.08.03 Exceptions. Sections 6.08.01 and 6.08.02 are hereby declared not applicable to areas to be annexed to the City of Harrison. Areas annexed can continue to maintain livestock on a similar level as a non-conforming and pre-existing use.

6.08.04 Wild animals. Wild animals found within the city limits of the City of Harrison, Arkansas, will be picked up by the Animal Control Officer or any other officer of the Harrison

Police Department. If the animal is thought to be rabid, the individual requesting the animal to be tested will be assessed the costs associated with any such tests. (Ord. No. 824, Sec. 2)
